**Title** Rassambleau

**Location** The Alexander, 300 Alexander Court, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

**Description** Rassambleau is a public art environment at 300 Alexander Court in Philadelphia. The project creates a new public street, pocket park and motor court located between the new Alexander apartment tower and The Church of the Latter-day Saints Meeting House. This project creates an elegant and welcoming streetscape with a courtyard that speaks to the historic context of the neighborhood and the strong tradition of Philadelphia's brick and masonry architecture. The ensemble of linked sculptures consists of courtyard paving, bronze luminaries, curb swales for storm water management, granite fountain sculptures, and stone benches. Like much of Cliff Garten Studio's work, this project focuses on the idea of integrating art into public places and infrastructure. Rassambleau challenges the quality of the street environment and storm water management infrastructure to explore design possibilities for rain gardens in an innovative manner.
